## Dear Supporter,

As the year winds down, many are considering ways to maximize their impact and minimize their tax bill for 2023. Clatsop County Historical Society (CCHS) presents an extraordinary opportunity to achieve both with our Scanning Center fundraising initiative.

From November 15th until the year's end, every donation you make to our Scanning Center will be matched dollar for dollar, thanks to a generous \$10,000 donation from a local benefactor, with a commitment to match up to \$20,000. Our aim is to raise \$40,000 to expand our digital archives, including precious narratives from pioneer families and historical records from local organizations.

Here's where the magic happens: If you donate \$1,000 to our initiative, not only will your impact double to \$2,000 due to our matching program, but you also receive a tax deduction. For example, if you're in the 20% tax bracket, your net cost for a \$1,000 donation is effectively only \$800 after the tax deduction.

But there's more! Oregonians can take advantage of the OREGON'S CULTURAL TAX CREDIT (OCTC) program. By donating to CCHS, you can direct a portion of your taxes—funds you'd pay anyway—to support cultural projects in the state, amplifying your impact even further.
